This document is a basic list of possible funding resources for arts education-related programs; it is not comprehensive. Many organizations have quarterly and/or annual deadlines and specific guidelines to follow when submitting a proposal, so be sure to contact them early and plan ahead.

Some organizations can only fund projects in a specific geographic area, or particular academic/discipline areas. Don't forget to start close to home – often parents, PTA/PTOs and local businesses can be a good place to start, particularly for “in-kind” donations of materials, supplies and refreshments.
